The following requirements are for students who matriculate to a post-secondary institution in the Summer of 2008 and thereafter.

Pre-Business Curriculum

Student must have completed all Pre-Business courses and 24 credits in residence prior to or during the semester in which they apply to the School of Business

Communications Part A*
Economics 101 or Economics 111 (honors)
Psychology 202 or 281 (honors)
Math 211, 217 or Math 221

* One course designated as Comm. Part A in the Timetable (Preferably Com Arts 100, English 100, or English 118 for non-native speakers) or Exemption from Comm. Part A based on UW Placement Test

**Advanced business courses are all courses at the 300 level and above, but do not include the following: Actuarial Science 303, Information Systems 371, Real Estate 306, Accounting 301, International Business 200, Risk Management and Insurance 300.

Liberal Studies Curriculum

School of Business students must complete the following Liberal Studies requirements prior to graduation. Students may not use a single course to fulfill multiple Liberal Studies requirements.

Communications Part B	One 3 (or more) credit Communications Part b course
Literature	One 3 (or more) credit Literature course.
Science	6 credits (or more) Biological, Natural, or Physical Science courses.
Foreign Language	3 units (or more) of the same foreign language (1 unit =1 year high school or 1 semester college). For. lang. retro-credits will be included in the 120 degree credits needed for BBA degree.
Ethics	One Philosophy course: Philosophy 241 or Philosophy 243 or Philosophy 341 or Philosophy 441
Humanities	One 3 (or more) credit Humanities course.
Ethnic Studies	One 3 (or more) credit ethnic studies course.
Social Science	One 3 (or more) credit Social Studies course
Advanced Math/ Statistics	One Advanced Math or Statistics course: Math 213 or Math 222 or General Business 304*
